Security, Openness and Privacy

It was understood that privacy, openness, and security should not be traded off against one another or seen as opposing priorities. All three need to be considered in every issue that falls within this theme. The sessions from previous years have shown the inextricable interconnection of the three policy areas and have shown that they were all equally important and equally complex.

In 2010, instead of segregating this theme into three silos, the session will orient itself to a few specific and timely issues and investigate them in the light of security, openness and privacy considerations. In order to manage this session, there will be three moderators to ensure sufficient expertise and facilitation of the dialogue on the three themes in relation to the issues.

1. Libertad de expresión y libre flujo de información

Aparentemente es un tema no contestado, pero las apariencias no siempre son ciertas.

Límites o no de la libertad de expresión en internet?

- Libertad de expresión en temas específicos (la sexualidad, la religión, el racismo).
- Presencia de medios tradicionales en internet y la regulación tradicional de los gobiernos.
- Códigos de autorregulación y códigos de ética de periodistas repensados a la luz de Internet.
- Internet requiere un tratamiento distinto a los medios tradicionales?

2. Acceso al conocimiento y acceso a información

Un nuevo régimen de propiedad intelectual que facilite el acceso al conocimiento y que sea adecuado para una sociedad de la información, para medios digitales, y para las necesidades del desarrollo. Creative commons. Acceso a datos públicos - “open data”. Democratización de internet vs. su apropiación por las empresas del conocimiento.

3. Infraestructura abierta

Backbone compartido. Costos de interconexión. Neutralidad de la red. TIC como bienes públicos globales y el rol de estado y del mercado en la provisión de esos bienes. Pago de peaje arbitrario dentro de la red.

4. Oportunidades abiertas

Entornos de competencia. Antimonopolio. Posibilidades para que nuevos actores entren en mercados para innovación. Modelos de negocios.

5. Tecnología abierta

Software libre y de código abierto, estándares abiertos (incluyendo formato de archivos, hardware, protocolos), neutralidad de la red .

6. Gobernanza abierta

Posibilidades de participación activa, diversificada, multisectorial. Apertura del modelo de gobernabilidad. Estándares mínimos para tener un modelo de gobernanza más consistente.
